

EVACUATION ORDER
Quilpituk Creek Wildfire
Regional District of Central Okanagan
2026-08-02 at 14:50 Hours

Pursuant to Section 77(1) of the *Emergency and Disaster Management Act*, an **Evacuation Order** has been issued by the Regional District of Central Okanagan Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) due to immediate danger to life safety caused by wildfire.

Members of the RCMP and other applicable agencies will be expediting this action. With the Quilpituk Creek and Bradley Creek wildfires burning to the north and south of this region, evacuations are currently underway to assure safe passage through the fire area. At this time, no structures are immediately threatened. Westside Road from Nahun northward is restricted to emergency vehicles and those needing to evacuate.

The Evacuation Order is in effect for the following areas within the Regional District of Central Okanagan Electoral Area West:

YOU MUST LEAVE THE AREA IMMEDIATELY - TRAVELLING SOUTH

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO:

- Create an ESS profile at: [Evacuee Registration & Assistance \(ERA\) Tool](#) at ess.gov.bc.ca or at an ESS Muster / Reception Centre (Reception Centre Westbank Lions Community Centre, 2466 Main St, West Kelowna BC V4T 1Z1)
- Shut off all gas and electrical appliances, other than refrigerators and freezers.
- Close all windows and doors.
- Close gates (latch) but do not lock.
- Gather all household members and, if you have room, take a neighbour or someone needing transportation. Do not use more vehicles than you have to.
- Take critical items (medicine, purse, wallet, and keys) and a minimum of one week's worth of supplies including food, water, toiletries, and weather appropriate clothing only if they are immediately available. Take pets in pet kennels or on leash.
- Do not use the telephone unless you need emergency service.
